LAUNCH OF LA MONTRÉALAISE CYCLOSPORTIVE

Saint-Lambert, Québec, Monday, February 11, 2013 – Serge Arsenault and his team at the Québec City and Montréal Grands Prix Cyclistes are pleased to announce, after more than a year in development, the official launch of La Montréalaise cyclosportive, and the opening of registration tomorrow at 2 p.m. on the website cyclosquebecoises.com. On Saturday, September 14, Québec's largest city will welcome amateur riders to the premiere of this new cycling adventure organized in parallel with the Montréal Grand Prix Cycliste. La Montréalaise and La Québécoise, which will be officially unveiled tomorrow in Québec City, are the only such events in North America to be held in conjunction with UCI WorldTour events.

"Today is such a great day for us and for all Québec cyclists!" said Serge Arsenault, President of the Québec City and Montréal Grands Prix Cyclistes, and the driving force behind the cyclosportives. "La Québécoise, a cycling-for-all event, is the key addition that makes the Québec City and Montréal Grands Prix Cyclistes events complete: we now have a week-long festival of cycling for both the general public and professionals! This cyclosportive will be a celebration for everyone who accepts the challenge we're offering them: to train and prepare to go the distance, and become standard-bearers of health and fitness for all," he added.

Challenges for all rider levels,

the contrast of Montréal's urban spirit and the authenticity of rural Montérégie

This end-of-season cycling rendezvous features three captivating courses of different distances, allowing each rider to meet a challenge suited to his or her personal objectives, in a festive, supervised and secure environment. La Montréalaise will offer multifaceted city and country sights along its 95 km, 145 km and 190 km courses. After a mass start on the Island of Montréal, riders will head for the South Shore, enjoying great views of the city skyline. From there, the Montérégie and its *Circuit du paysan* will take cyclists through grain and corn fields, apple orchards and vineyards. The more combative riders will continue on a circuit covering 190 km, including a 30 km stretch parallel to the U.S. border offering a succession of ascents and descents that culminates in the 342 m Covey Hill climb, not far from Hemmingford. Riders on all three loops will return to cross the finish line in downtown Montréal, greeted by applause from family, friends and onlookers.

"The City of Montréal is proud to host the all new sporting initiative which is the Cyclosportive La Montréalaise. This new event, which targets amateurs as well as more accomplished athletes, embellishes the sport tourism offerings of our metropolis. Just like the wave of activities which take place during this beautiful season in Montréal, La Montréalaise will encourage us to adopt a safe and active mode of transportation through cycling," declared Mr. Richard Deschamps, responsible for sports and leisure on the executive committee of the City of Montréal.
