This sustainable development policy is the result of Événements GPCQM's determination to integrate sustainable development into the very heart of its strategies, thereby demonstrating its strong commitment to ecoresponsible practices aimed at **minimizing its ecological footprint** and **increasing its positive impact**.

The purpose of this document is to create a framework for the organization, given its capabilities and challenges, in its procedures, actions, strategies and development.

Inspired by the Fédération québécoise des sports cyclistes (FQSC), the Conseil québécois des événements écoresponsables (CQEER), the UCI, and other organizations, this policy outlines the way Événements GPCQM thinks and acts, as well as the **objectives** that define **its ecoresponsible approach**.

SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

"Sustainable development is a development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs."



According to the Rio de Janeiro Declaration (1992), sustainable development is based on three pillars: **economic development, social development and environmental protection.**

These three pillars are interdependent and must be interrelated to ensure **sustainability.**

SCOPE OF APPLICATION

This official document invites employees, volunteers and all those linked to the organization and its events (suppliers, partners, collaborators, event participants, etc.) to take part in this ecoresponsible approach.

This policy serves as a frame of reference for Événements GPCQM's sustainable development orientations, for all associated stakeholders, so that they may participate in achieving the objectives to which the organization is committed.

Événements GPCQM applies this policy within the limits of its field of action and in compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

MISSION & VALUES

MISSION

To produce and present **UCI WorldTour** road cycling events in North America, with the aim of contributing to the sport's worldwide reputation and passing on a positive, inspiring and lasting legacy to future generations.

VALUES







The policy of Événements GPCQM reflects its commitment to respecting and promoting the principles of sustainable development, both in its activities and in its organizational operations.

The objectives set out in this policy are primarily based on the ecoresponsibility criteria and objectives of the FQSC's ecoresponsibility policy, as well as the City of Montreal's ecoresponsibility index and the UCI's sustainability guidelines.

These objectives also take into account **the 16 principles of Quebec's Sustainable Development Act**, and are closely linked to the organization's strategies.

THE 4 FUNDAMENTAL OBJECTIVES OF ÉVÉNEMENTS GPCQM

1.

INTEGRATE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AT THE HEART OF ÉVÉNEMENTS GPCQM STRATEGIES

- To collectively develop and implement an ecoresponsible action plan integrating all the major sustainable development issues related to the organization of cycling events.
- Obtain ecoresponsibility certifications, comply with current standards and indicators suggested by renowned entities (Eco-FQSC certification, BNQ 9700-253 standard, City of Montréal ecoresponsibility indicators, CQEER, etc.).
- Develop an ecoresponsibility manual for suppliers and the organization's various departments, and ensure compliance with established criteria.

2.

PROMOTE ECORESPONSIBILITY AND RAISE AWARENESS OF THE POSITIVE IMPACT OF SUCH AN APPROACH

- Take part in and implement initiatives to raise awareness of sustainable development issues and promote ecoresponsibility among the general public and collaborators.
- Encourage carpooling, active and public transports, notably through initiatives and partnerships with other organizations (STM, FQSC, Vélo Québec, Bixi, etc.).
- Encourage athletes (professional and amateur) and other stakeholders to reduce and compensate for the carbon emissions associated with their travel.







MAKE THE 4 R-V'S PHILOSOPHY A GUIDING PRINCIPLE FOR THE ACTIONS TO BE IMPLEMENTED



- Prioritize partnerships with local, eco-friendly, second-hand, socially responsible, recycling suppliers, cooperatives and organizations committed to sustainable development.
- Reduce the quantity of residual materials at the source, based on the 4R-V principle, notably by expanding the range of reusable containers and by using recyclable and compostable components.
- Strengthen communication and awareness of waste management and energy conservation among the general public and collaborators.

FOCUS ON COLLABORATION AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

- Develop initiatives to include and give back to the community.
- Develop initiatives to support Québec's cycling elite (Team Canada participation, "Jeunes Teneurs" program, Coupe du Québec sponsorship, etc.).
- Work closely with youth by offering academic mandates for university students (case studies and internships).

IMPLEMENTATION

An action plan has been created to implement this policy, outlining Événements GPCQM's ambitions in terms of sustainable development. The various actions already carried out and planned have been drawn up according to a number of indicators, namely :

- EcoFQSC Certification
- City of Montréal ecoresponsibility indicators
- CQEER ecoresponsible event indicators
- Standard BNQ 9700-253 : Responsible Event Management (currently under public consultation)

This action plan is broken down according to the **4 fundamental objectives** set by the organization and a timeline over **the next 3 years** (2024, 2025, 2026).





ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

This policy was written by the sustainable development team, consisting of Maxime Berthiaume, Sport and Logistics Project Manager, and Chloé Fouquet, Sustainable Development Coordinator.

This team works in close collaboration with event's direction, the board of directors and the organizing committee to ensure that the present policy is applied.

START DATE

This first edition of Événements GPCQM's sustainable development policy is in effect since January 1, 2024. The committee plans an annual review to ensure its relevance.
