Québec City and Montréal, August 11, 2026 -

With just one month to go before the 15th edition of the Grands Prix Cyclistes de Québec et de Montréal, the list of teams set to compete on September 11 and 13 is now official.

A total of 22 teams will take part.

→ 18 UCI WorldTeams—every one of the world's top professional cycling teams:

- Lotto Intermarché (Belgium)
- Movistar Team (Spain)
- Netcompany Ineos (Great Britain)

→ 3 UCI ProTeams have received an invitation:

- Tudor Pro Cycling Team (Switzerland), winner of the 2025 Grand Prix Cycliste de Québec thanks to Julian Alaphilippe
- Pinarello-Q36.5 Pro Cycling Team (Switzerland), whose roster includes British rider Tom Pidcock, winner of the 2024 Amstel Gold Race and the 2023 Strade Bianche
- Modern Adventure Pro Cycling (United States), founded and led by former American rider George Hincapie

→ Canada's national team has also been invited and will compete, as it has since the very first edition. This gives young riders the chance to test themselves against the best in the world.



ABOUT THE GRANDS PRIX CYCLISTES DE QUÉBEC ET DE MONTRÉAL

Created in 2010, the Grands Prix Cyclistes de Québec et de Montréal are the only UCI WorldTour races held in the Americas. Every year, the world's best professional cycling teams and champions go head-to-head in two races widely regarded as among the most demanding and prestigious on the international calendar.

On September 11 and 13, the 15th edition will take place less than ten days before the UCI Road World Championships Montréal 2026. With 22 teams at the start line—including all 18 WorldTeams—and updated courses, the Grands Prix Cyclistes de Québec et de Montréal will serve as a key test ahead of cycling's biggest event of 2026.
